New in Town

Adult Day Care Colwood's first private adult daycare will be opening soon on Kelly Road, the first of its kind in B.C. The Open Hearts Adult Day Care will provide a safe place for people with dementia, allowing their caregivers a temporary respite so that they can do the shopping, attend appointments or get much-needed time for themselves. There will be space for up to 10 adults, with care from trained professionals. For more information call Nicole Donaldson at 250-391-9827.

Colwood Corners Look for some redevelopment of the Colwood Plaza, perhaps as early as next summer. The first phase of this re-development will take place along the Sooke Road/Colwood Crescent area, with a new larger London Drugs building, new office/retail space and residential units. The maximum heights on the Sooke Road side will be five storeys, with a planned 25 storey residential tower at the back of the site.

Latoria Road With the improving economy, several exciting new changes are planned along Latoria Road: ☉ A Red Barn Market will be opening at Latoria Walk next year ☉ A new residential/commercial development is planned for 591 Latoria, including a brew pub ☉ A new 27 unit townhome development is planned for 3580 Wishart Road (at Latoria), together with extensive restoration of Latoria Creek.

Other developments are in the planning stages; look for more to come.

Rapid Transit Update

BC Transit is moving ahead with plans for a rapid transit system from the West Shore to downtown Victoria. The West Shore portion will go along Goldstream Avenue and have dedicated lanes down Island Highway to the Six Mile area (there will still be two lanes of traffic plus a centre turning lane). From there, it will go to Uptown and then downtown.

Decisions yet to be made are: ☉ Should it be a rapid bus or a light rail system? **and** ☉ Should the dedicated lanes along Island Highway be along the outside of both of the traffic lanes (curb-side option) or have the transit lanes together on the Juan de Fuca side of the road (side-running option)?

... and being prepared for winter weather safety

Snow and Ice Removal: To help the City of Colwood provide the best service, please avoid parking on the road during bad weather or when temperatures fall below zero. Illegally parked vehicles will be towed, and cul du sacs will not be serviced if cars are parked there.

Winter Drainage: Help us keep roadside catch basins clear by removing leaves from culverts and ensuring that surface drains are clear of mud and debris.

Private roadways are not maintained by the City. Snow and ice removal is the responsibility of the property owner. Please ensure that arrangements are made to maintain private roadways and drainage systems, particularly during the fall and winter months.

This is the vision for the school site at Royal Bay. Colwood and Langford Councils have been lobbying hard for new high schools at Royal Bay and Glen Lake, replacing the badly outdated facilities at Belmont. In addition, Colwood has been working with a variety of partners,

including the West Shore Chamber of Commerce and School District 62, to explore the development of a premier arts and cultural facility immediately next door, in cooperation with the federal and provincial governments and First Nations. This co-location will provide lots of shared benefits, as well as cost savings for both venues, and will be a tremendous economic boost for the whole region.

Suite Reminder ... Secondary Suite Registration Deadline January 7, 2011

If you have a secondary suite, you **MUST** register it. Suites built before July 1, 2009 can get a 'Class 2' permit, which means they do not have to meet current building code, if you register before 4:00 p.m. on **Friday, January 7, 2011**. Failure to register by this cut-off date means that your suite will have to comply with 'Class 1' permit regulations as well as current B.C. Building Code standards.
